1. **Call to Order**

Mrs. Tilton, Chair called the Special Meeting of the Plymouth Board of Education Curriculum & Instruction Committee to order at 5:01 p.m.

2. **Adoption of the Agenda**

MOTION: To entertain a motion to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion Mr. Foote, second Mrs. Kulesa, any discussion, if none, all in favor, any opposed, any abstentions, motion carries.

3. **Current High School Offerings & Program of Studies**

Superintendent Brian Falcone and Terryville High School Principal, Michael Hults discussed the current courses being offered at Terryville High School. The discussion included available college coursework options for students, the Career Center, and the opportunities it provides, and potential pathway options for students. They emphasized the administration's overall goal of creating individualized plans for students, so they clearly understand their next steps after graduation.

4. **EdAdvance Pathways Program**

The administration discussed EdAdvance's College Accelerator Program. There are currently no students enrolled in the College Accelerator Program. The program was initially introduced with no associated cost to the district or to parents; however, it now carries a cost of \$300 per course and \$6,600 for transportation services. Due to these new tuition and transportation expenses, the program is no longer a financially feasible option for the district. Additionally, the program's new service model was discussed, which would require Terryville High School teachers to deliver the College Accelerator coursework which the district pays EdAdvance for support and professional development. Given the current lack of student interest, the district will not pursue this option at this time.
