

Items and/or projects utilizing funds from the Sussex County one time RTT (Realty Transfer Taxes) Grant

- 12 Motorola APX Portable 8000 radios with accessories at \$4,581.75 each X 12=\$54,981.00. These radios will be essential for the full-time police (10) and seasonal officers (20) to communicate.
- Two town public safety cameras with antennas plus installation \$9,875.00. The town cameras and antennas are essential for monitoring public safety and enhances emergency police, fire, and medical responds.
- Polaris 4X4 Public Safety Rescue Vehicle \$15,699.00. The vehicle is crucial in the ability to respond to EMS incidents on the town's 1-mile-long beach. The vehicle allows the lifeguards or EMS to transport essential equipment to the injured victim on the beach.
- DK2 Single Axle Multi Utility Trailer with drive up gate 5'X7' = \$1,750.00. The trailer will assist the lifeguards moving rescue board, lifeguard chair, equipment for the junior guard program, and other essential equipment on the beach.
- Marine Rescue Soft Boards 11' used for public safety rescue 4 X \$995.00=\$3,980.00 plus \$500.00 for shipping= \$4,480.00. The boards are used by the lifeguards to rescue distressed swimmers offshore. The boards are also used to transport injured victims out of the surf.
- Philips Onsite AED Package \$1,350.00 X 7= \$9,450.00 (5 for the lifeguards and 2 for town building). The AEDs are essential for saving human lives that have gone into cardiac arrest.
- Ford Ranger 4X4 4-door use for public works, property/building inspection, snow removal, beach maintenance \$39,540.00. The truck is essential for the day-to-day operation by the code/building official to observe that there are safe conditions on construction sites and monitoring unsafe conditions regarding equipment and machinery. The building official will also use the truck to move town public works equipment on the beach, ensure large debris is scheduled for pick up, and will be equipped with a snowplow during plowing winter conditions.
- Snowplow \$2,000.00. Will be used to remove snow from the town streets and is essential for the public safety.
- Stormwater pipe re-lining and replacement \$46,223.00. A town stormwater survey and plan was drafted by the Engineering Firm Remington and Vernick. The proposal to re-line and when necessary, replace stormwater pipes in the town will cost over \$100,000.00. This work on the Town of Dewey Beach's stormwater infrastructure system is essential for combating flooding, public safety on roads, and safe drainage back into the bay. The town will match \$46,223.00 for a total of \$92,446.00.
