Subject:

Parks and Public Spaces

I believe that City governments' most effective role in economic development is to create a place people want to live in by maintaining high quality public environments, including a decent system of parks and public spaces. Public spaces include tree-lined streets, squares, traffic islands, and landscaping in parking lots.

I described what I called the "Park Improvement Initiative" in my budget memo for this year's budget, which said:

"We have been focusing more attention on Thompson Park, which is one of the City's most valuable assets. The importance of making improvements here is reinforced by several Goals and Strategies identified in the adopted Comprehensive Plan and Strategic Goals and Objectives. Parks & Recreation, Public Works, Planning, and GIS have been coordinating their efforts to make improvements. The volunteer program has also been re-started after a COVID hiatus.

This budget contains several items to assist with this effort. The Light Equipment Operator/Municipal Worker I on the DPW Buildings and Grounds crew has been re-instated. This position was cut two years ago in anticipation of consolidation of grass mowing operations that did not occur. More funds for seasonal workers have also been added to the Parks and Playgrounds budget for trail work and invasive brush removal. Replacement of old equipment is proposed to improve the efficiency of the work.

The Parks and Recreation accounts have been re-organized to separate programs and events from maintenance. There are now maintenance accounts for Parks and Playgrounds and Athletic Facilities. Programs, including staffing of the playgrounds, are included in the Program and Events account."

We were not able to hire the additional seasonal employees, because of the lack of applicants. GYMO donated the services of a company to bring in a machine for half a day to clear buckthorn in Thompson Park. We were impressed by the work they did and hired them to widen Middle Trail. The park volunteers exceeded expectations for how much work was done last year.

The City's ballfields are very well maintained, and we have a very good tree program. We should continue to maintain those standards. We could, however, put more resources into other aspects of the landscape. The resources can be in the form of additional employees, contracted services, and volunteer efforts. The Thompson Park master plan will provide guidance for landscape improvements in that park.

Recreation Programs and Events

While only government provides public parks, recreation programs and events can be provided by other organizations. I consider them to be optional governmental services but are within the Council's authority to provide. The primary events that the Department of Parks and Recreation is involved in are:

There is a need for a person to coordinate and promote programs and events, especially if we continue to play a larger role in the Concert in the Park and other activities are added.

Recreation Fees

Council Member Olney requested information on who pays what recreational fees. A list of the primary facility users and what they pay is attached. The current fee schedule is also attached.

Sports Fields Assessment

Council Member Olney also requested an assessment of our sports fields. As noted above, we consider them to be in very good condition. That doesn't mean that there couldn't be an improvement made here and there.

We don't believe we need additional fields at this time, though lighting another field would helpful. A big improvement to the fields would be to convert North

into a four-field clover facility (potentially lighted). It would be an improvement for local leagues and would draw tournaments to the area. However, it would not increase the number of fields and it would be a significant expense.

This year we plan to add the practice fields at North Star and Sacred Heart to our software. This will encourage additional use and allow us to track usage. These two fields are used by Little League free of charge.

We also plan to cut out the infield on Marble #2. Marble fields currently don't see much use, but they have great potential, especially with bathrooms and pavilion nearby. Changing the infield from grass to clay will increase usage and therefore open up some of the other fields. This would be a good candidate for lights in the future.

There have been several suggestions for other types of new recreational facilities. We are considering proposing that a needs survey and assessment be done to determine what we are short on and what the public would actually use. A list of our current primary facilities is attached.
