Regular County Commission Meeting Minutes Tuesday, September 2, 2025

The Board of County Commission met in regular session Tuesday, September 2, 2025 at 9:00 am. Those present were Chairman Wayne Wilt, Vice Chairman Jim Maxwell, Commissioner Alan Groom, Lucas Goff, County Administrator, Mark Krusor, County Counselor and Karen Madison, County Clerk. Commissioner Groom moved, Vice Chairman Maxwell seconded to approve the consent agenda as presented. Vote 3-0

- Ralph Brankel, Rock resident, addressed Commissioners regarding flooding in the unincorporated area of Rock. He is also concerned with trees covering stop signs.
- Michael Secavek, Liberty township landowner, addressed Commissioners regarding the road
 to his property in Liberty Township. Michael has rented equipment to put a crown on the road
 to have it in good condition to get to his property. His concern was if the Commissioners were
 going to be able to do anything for the road. Commissioners agreed it is between Michael and
 Liberty Township Officers.
- Penny McPherson, New Salem resident, addressed Commissioners regarding a large chicken operation in the area. She is concerned with the possible size of the operation, the excrement from the chickens, the smell, area dogs and the well water. She is also concerned about the nearness of the Winfield City Lake. Tom Langer, City-Cowley County Health Department Director, addressed several of the concerns raised regarding the chicken farm. The owners have reached out to him to be sure they are following health standards. Tom has researched the effects of the chicken farm and how it will affect the floodplain area. Tom offered to check the well water now and as time moves on with the operation of the farm. Tom stated the waste can be sold as a subproduct and that seems to be the intention of the owners. Bill McPherson, 112th Road resident, asked what will happen during the day with the chickens roaming around. Chaiman Wilt stated, while he understands the concerns, there is no zoning in the County, so the Commissioners have no authority to regulate the business. Tom stated he will continue to monitor the business and the waste that is excreted from the chicken farm. Lacey Shields, owner of the chicken farm, spoke to the reasons she has decided to raise chickens.

She is also upset at the amount of property taxes she pays and does not live on a paved street with gutters and struggles to get street lights fixed. Monie Donlay, Winfield resident, was upset the meeting was during the day and also upset at township roads not getting grated while she continues to pay property taxes. She is also upset with the money going to the college. Larry Alley, Winfield resident and Kansas State Senator, addressed Commissioners to begin a conversation of what can actually be done for rising property taxes. He suggested statewide sales tax helping to offset the college mill levy and the school general fund. He is also disappointed at the lack of turnout. Michael Secavek, likes the idea of sales tax helping to cover things that property tax funds. Chairman Wilt moved, Commissioner Groom seconded to close the public hearing. Vote 3-0

- Lucas Goff, County Administrator, addressed Commissioners regarding a federal funded project for bridge replacements. A partnership between Butler County and Cowley County is forming to apply for the federal funds. With possible State matches, the project would be a 30 bridge project, 15 in each county. If awarded, the approximate county investment would be a total of \$1 million.
