**RESOLUTION NO. 6-26**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF UPPER DARBY TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AUTHORIZING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN UPPER DARBY TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT AND EAST LANSDOWNE BOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE INSTALLATION AND USE OF THREE PUBLIC SAFETY CAMERAS OWNED BY EAST LANSDOWNE BOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT AND TO BE MOUNTED AND INSTALLED FOR USE BY THE UPPER DARBY TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT**

**WHEREAS**, Upper Darby Township (“Township”) is a Home Rule municipality organized and operating in accordance with the Charter of Upper Darby Township (“Charter”) as permitted by the Home Rule Charter and Optional Plans Law, 53 Pa. C.S. §2901 et seq. (“Home Rule Law”); and

**WHEREAS**, East Lansdowne Borough (“Borough”) is a Borough organized and operating in accordance with Pennsylvania Borough Code (“Code”) as permitted by, 8 Pa. C.S. §§ 101 et seq.,

**WHEREAS**, Upper Darby Township Police Department (“UDPD”) and East Lansdowne Borough Police Department (“ELPD”) mutually desire to establish a cooperative framework for the installation and use of three public safety cameras owned by ELPD and mounted; installed; and maintained by UDPD on traffic control signal poles at locations mutually agreed to by the parties as established in the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township wishes to formally adopt and give full force to the attached Memorandum of Understanding by Resolution; and

**WHEREAS**, Article 9, Section 5 of the Pennsylvania Constitution and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act of 1996, 53 Pa. C.S.A. § 2301 *et seq.*, authorize two or more local governments to jointly cooperate with each other in the exercise or performance of their respective governmental functions, powers and responsibilities; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 2135 of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 53 Pa. C.S.A. § 2315, provides that a joint cooperation agreement shall be deemed in force as to any local

government when the agreement has been adopted by ordinance or resolution by all cooperating local governments; and

**WHEREAS**, a copy of the Memorandum of Understanding, the contents of which are incorporated into this Resolution in order to satisfy the requirements of Section 2307 of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 53 Pa. C.S.A. § 2307, is attached hereto as **Exhibit “A”**; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Upper Darby Township Council, and it is hereby **ADOPTED** and **RESOLVED** by authority of same as follows:

1. The Memorandum of Understanding attached hereto as Exhibit A is approved, and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute same on behalf of the Township.
2. All resolutions, or parts thereof, inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.
3. The provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable. If any provision of this Resolution is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Resolution.
4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon the signature of the Mayor or, in the event the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes this Resolution, fifteen days after the last day on which the Mayor can approve or veto this Resolution, as set forth in the Upper Darby Township Home Rule Charter, Section C-702.C.
