RESOLUTION NO. 7-26

A RESOLUTION OF UPPER DARBY TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AUTHORIZING APPLICATION TO THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF DELAWARE COUNTY FOR AN ALLOCATION OF COUNTY LIQUID FUEL TAX FUNDS TO BE USED IN THE IMPROVEMENT OF RESURFACING VARIOUS STREETS THROUGHOUT THE TOWNSHIP; REPEALING ALL INCONSISTENT RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS THEREOF; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Upper Darby Township desires to take advantage of the act approved June 1, 1954, P.P. 1242 and as provided in the act approved May 18, 1945, P.P. 803, permitting counties of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to appropriate and expend moneys for the improvement and maintenance of state highways and state aid highways or any public highway in any county of the Commonwealth.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **RESOLVED** by Upper Darby Township Council, and it is hereby **ADOPTED** and **RESOLVED** by authority of same as follows:

SECTION I.

Upper Darby Township hereby makes application to the County Council of Delaware County for an allocation of County Liquid Fuel Tax funds in the amount of \$66,204.00 to be used in the improvement of:

RESURFACING VARIOUS STREETS THROUGHOUT
THE TOWNSHIP,
ESTIMATED TOTAL COST OF PROJECT: \$66,204.00

It is certified by the Municipality and the Officers who execute this application that all materials used, and work done hereunder, shall conform to the current Pennsylvania Department of Transportation ("Department") specifications, or specifications approved by the Department, and all work will be done with the legal right of way or with permission of the abutting property owners.

SECTION II. REPEALER

All resolutions, or parts thereof, inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.

SECTION III. SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable. If any provision of this Resolution is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such

determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Resolution or on the Upper Darby Township Fee Schedule.


SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE
