WHEREAS, the Village of Spring Valley operates on a fiscal year beginning June 1 and ending May 31, and is required to adopt a budget for the upcoming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to New York State General Municipal Law § 3-c, the Village is subject to an annual tax levy limit, unless the Village Board of Trustees adopts a local law and/or resolution to override such limit by the affirmative vote of at least sixty percent (60%) of the total voting power of the Board; and

LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 239 OF THE CODE OF THE
VILLAGE OF SPRING VALLEY (TAXICABS AND VEHICLES FOR
HIRE)"**

At a meeting of the Village of Spring Valley Board of Trustees held on the 21st day of April 2026, at the Village Hall in said Village, _____ moved the adoption of the following resolution and Trustee _____ seconded.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Spring Valley is authorized pursuant to the New York State Constitution, the Municipal Home Rule Law, and the Village Law to adopt local laws relating to the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 239 of the Code of the Village of Spring Valley governs the licensing, regulation, and operation of taxicabs and vehicles for hire within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the best interests of the Village to amend Chapter 239 in order to update, clarify, and strengthen provisions relating to taxicabs and vehicles for hire; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Local Law entitled "Local Law No. __ of 2026 – A Local Law Amending Chapter 239 of the Code of the Village of Spring Valley (Taxicabs and Vehicles for Hire)" was introduced to the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, a duly noticed Public Hearing on said proposed Local Law was held before the Board of Trustees on February 10, 2026 adjourned to March 17, 2026 and further adjourned to April 21, 2026, at which time all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, after due consideration of the comments received, the Board of Trustees has determined to adopt said Local Law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Spring Valley, County of Rockland, State of New York, as follows:
