WHEREAS, The Authority intends to award a contract for the purchase of Wachs Valve Trailer through the BuyBoard Contract # 684-22 in the amount of \$96,983.74, and;

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the requirements of Public Law 2010 Chapter 139 and the Local Public Contracts Law the Authority verifies the following in reference to the BuyBoard contract: # 684-22 Wachs Valve Trailer

- 1. That the use of the cooperative purchasing agreement shall result in cost savings after all factors, including charges for service, material, and delivery, has been considered by one of the following:
  - a. Comparing current State contract pricing, available to other government entities, to that of the proposed national cooperative.
  - Comparing pricing for comparable goods or services under the contracting unit's current contracts or contracts available to it (i.e., New Jersey government based cooperative purchasing programs) to that of the proposed national cooperative.
  - Comparing recently procured comparable contracts entered by other public entities to that of the proposed national cooperative.
- 2. The national cooperative contract was awarded through a "competitive bidding process" that included open competition, or competition among those qualified or pre-qualified, submission of bids, and awarded pursuant to a "lowest responsible", "most advantageous to the public entity, price and other factors considered", or other similar standard employed by a public entity. This excludes contract awards based on unadvertised, "invitation only," negotiated, local preference, or sole source procurement practices.
- 3. The "competitive bidding process" that was used by the original contract awarding agency complies with N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 and 20.5 (pay-to-play laws) and at a minimum, the original contract awarding agency did the following:
  - a. Publicly advertised in newspapers or on the Internet website maintained by the public entity in sufficient time to give notice in advance of the contract;
  - b. Awarded under a process that provides for public solicitation of proposals or qualifications;
  - c. Awarded and disclosed under criteria established in writing by the public entity prior to the solicitation of proposals or qualifications; and
  - d. Publicly opened and announced when awarded.
- 4. The contract being awarded must have been awarded by a contracting unit as defined in c. 139, and was not awarded by a non-profit or private organization, even if a member of the cooperative. Stated differently, the original contract awarding agency meets the definition of a "contracting unit" as defined by New Jersey purchasing statutes.
- 5. The original bid was advertised as a national cooperative contract (or a regional contract that includes New Jersey in its region) not as a strictly local contract that was made "national" or "regional" after the receipt of bids.

### APPROVING AMENDMENT TO SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM RULES AND REGULATIONS

WHEREAS, the Lower Township Municipal Utilities Authority (the "Authority") has been formed, organized and exists in accordance with the Municipal and County Utilities Authority Law, N.J.S.A. 40:14B-1, et. seq., and the ordinances of the Township of Lower, in the County of Cape May; and

WHEREAS, §67-2 of the Code of the Township of Lower indicates that the Authority "shall have and exercise all of the powers and perform all of the duties provided for by the Municipal Utilities Authority's Law, and any other statutes heretofore or hereafter enacted and applicable thereto;" and

#### WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:14B-20 provides:

Every municipal authority shall be a public body politic and corporate constituting a political subdivision of the State established as an instrumentality exercising public and essential governmental functions to provide for the public health and welfare and shall have perpetual succession and have the following powers: ...(12) to make and enforce bylaws or rules and regulations for the management and regulation of its business and affairs and for the use, maintenance and operation of the utility system and any other of its properties, and to amend the same...; and

WHEREAS, as authorized by N.J.S.A. 40:14B-20, the Authority has adopted Rules and Regulations Governing Applications to the Lower Township Municipal Utilities Authority for the Construction of Comprehensive Sanitary Sewer Systems in the Township of Lower," the most recent version of which is dated June 3, 2009 (the "Sanitary Sewer System Rules and Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, Article IV of the Sanitary Sewer System Rules and Regulations, in part, provides:

Whenever a sanitary sewer collection system shall be operational in any given area of Lower Township, the owner of any property which abuts or is adjacent to any operational sewer main within the same sanitary sewer collection system shall, prior to, or as a condition of continued occupancy, be required to tie into said system, make use thereof and be subject to such costs and charges as shall be promulgated from time to time by the Authority pursuant to statutory authorization; and

WHEREAS, the Authority is in the process of completing and bringing online a significant expansion to its sanitary sewer system which will provide sanitary sewer system

services to areas of Lower Township that currently do not have available sanitary sewer services from the Authority and, as a result owners of property within that expanded service area will be required to connect to the system as required by the Sanitary Sewer System Rules and Regulations; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Directors is cognizant of the fact that the cost to a homeowner to decommission an existing septic system and to tie into the Authority's Sanitary Sewer System has greatly increased since the current Sanitary Sewer System Rules and Regulations were adopted in 2009 and for senior citizens who often lived on fixed incomes that expense can be prohibitive and, as a result, this Board of Directors deems it appropriate to amend the Sanitary Sewer System Rules and Regulations so as to implement a procedure that allows senior citizen property owners who qualify for property tax relief pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-8.41 to apply for a waiver from the connection obligation that otherwise is set forth in Article IV of the Sanitary Sewer System Rules and Regulations for so long as they continue to qualify for such property tax relief;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Members of the Lower Township Municipal Utility Authority, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1) All of the statements of the preamble are repeated and are incorporated herein by this reference thereto as though the same were set forth at length.
- 2) Article IV of the Sanitary Sewer System Rules and Regulations be, and it is hereby amended, to read as is set forth on **Exhibit "A"** annexed hereto and made a part hereof.
- 3) The Executive Director and the Authority Secretary are authorized to take all necessary and proper action to implement this Resolution.

# Exhibit "A"

### IV CONDITIONS REQUIRING INSTALLATION OF AND CONNECTION TO SANITARY SEWER SYSTEMS

Any major subdivision or any multi-family structure regardless of volume of flow, and all non-residential development shall be required to install a sanitary sewer collection system and to connect to the nearest operational sanitary sewer main in the Township in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinances of Lower Township and of these rules and regulations, except as herein provided.

Whenever a sanitary sewer collection system shall be operational in any given area of Lower Township, the owner of any property which abuts or is adjacent to any operational sewer main within the said sanitary sewer collection system shall, prior to, or as a condition of continued occupancy, be required to tie into said system, make use thereof and be subject to such costs and charges as shall be promulgated from time to time by the Authority pursuant to statutory authorization.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if at the time that the obligation to tie into the Authority's Sanitary Sewer System arises the owner of the property which otherwise would be required to tie into the Authority's Sanitary Sewer System is age 65 or more years and has received from the Lower Township Tax Collector a tax deduction against the real property taxes that are due on the subject property pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-8.41, as amended, then, upon written request by said property owner the obligation to tie into the Authority's sanitary sewer system may be delayed for so long as the owner of the subject property receives the tax deduction as aforesaid. Requests made pursuant to this paragraph shall be accompanied by written proof from the Lower Township Tax Collector that the property tax deduction has been granted. Requests made pursuant to this paragraph shall be subject to the review and approval of the Authority's Executive Director. The denial of any request made pursuant to this paragraph shall be subject to the further review of the Authority's Board of Directors which may reverse the decision of the Executive Director by Resolution upon good cause having been shown. Relief granted pursuant to this paragraph shall remain in effect for so long as the property owner is granted property tax relief pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-8.41. A property owner who receives relief pursuant to this paragraph shall provide the Authority Secretary with written proof, on an annual basis no later than April 30, that the real property tax deduction granted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-8.41, as amended, remains in effect.

In areas where lands are deemed by the Authority to be too remote from an operating sewer main, the Authority shall decide as to whether a "dry" sanitary sewer system shall be required in accordance with the Authority 's Sewer Master Plan. The Authority may also, at its discretion, and if requested by an Applicant, accept a sum of monies equal to the cost of the "dry" sanitary sewer system, engineering costs and restoration, if such payment is deemed to be in the Authority 's best interest. Such amount shall be unqualified and shall not be deemed to be a performance guarantee. The Authority will indicate the proposed location of the sewer mains to be included under the Authority's Sewer Master Plan as well as the size of each main to be included. The Sewer Master Plan for the Authority's sanitary sewer system facilities shall govern the location and size of all major sewer mains.
