2a) Town Councilor John Wheatley Report – Permit Fee Refund

3. Library Report – Susan Morgan, Director Onondaga Free Library

Onondaga Free Library Director, Susan Morgan, was present and reported that they are kicking off their summer reading program and this year’s theme is ***Color Our World***. It is an art-based program. Sign-ups for the July programs will open this Friday, 6/20. Ms. Morgan also thanked the Town’s Parks and Director, Charry Lawson, and parks staff who will be partnering with the library’s science group to bring a presentation of ***Rumpelstiltskin*** with the Red Theater on July 31st at 11:00 a.m. at Santaro Park. In case of rain, the presentation will be held at the Onondaga Free Library. Ms. Morgan also thanked the ***Friends of the Library*** group and ***Gannon’s Ice Cream*** for their participation and support. Ms. Morgan encouraged everyone to take advantage of the many program offerings and can be viewed on the library’s website. Ms. Morgan also reported that a fundraising event will be held at the Syracuse Mets stadium which includes a behind the scenes tour for about 20 people, on Friday July 18th at 10:00 a.m. The following week, a special game night will be held on July 26th in which a portion of the proceeds will go to the library. There is a link on the Mets website to purchase tickets and ensure the proceeds get directed to the library. She stated it is a great event to support the community and the library. Ms. Morgan also thanked the community for supporting the library. She stated that summer hours are in effect in which they will close at 2:00 p.m. on Saturdays until after Labor Day.

4. Highway Superintendent’s Report

Highway Superintendent John Smith reported that they are continuing with brush pick-up and are getting ready for paving next month. They are busy doing roadside mowing in the Navarino, Taunton and Howlett Hill areas. He also said they have been getting calls regarding drainage issues, and are addressing them as quickly as possible, but the abundance of rainfall makes it challenging.

Parks Director Lawson said that they are still in need of one Park Attendant for King Park, which amounts to 9 hours per week. She also reported that the summer concerts are set and that the flyers will be going out on Wednesday.

Ms. Lawson also reported that she received quotes for the basketball court fencing at Kelley Park that was damaged during a windstorm in the Spring, which was an insurance claim. Gasparini Landscaping came in with the lowest quote in the amount of \$2,765, resulting in the following resolution:

Parks Director Lawson also reported that one of the summer projects is to clean and resurface the basketball/tennis courts at Kelley Park, and paint all new lines, including pickleball lines to the tennis court. She stated that at Santaro Park , they are adding pickleball lines to one of the existing tennis courts. The lowest bid was from Okie Court Systems in the amount of \$23,600, which may be lower as the original estimate included two pickle ball courts at Kelley, but only one is being done.

Ms. Lawson also requested a resolution for the replacement of part of the fencing around the basketball court at Kelley Park. Instead of replacing the whole fence, they are going to repair or replace the rusted or broken sections. Gasparini was the lowest bidder in the amount of \$4,610, which would utilize the Community Development Fund. Supervisor Mahar asked if tree work is planned in order to avoid future damage during a storm. Ms. Lawson said that Rich Lamphier will be cutting back branches behind the fence, but the trees are not on Town owned property.

6. Attorney’s Report

6a) Jon Diaz Community Center Amendment Resolution

Town Attorney Nadine Bell requested a resolution to amend the Municipal Endorsement Resolution that was done on 8/5/24 for the Jon Diaz community Center grant. It was originally submitted stating the Town of Onondaga was applying for the grant, however it should have read the Jon Diaz Community Center, Inc. The following amendment resolution resulted:

WHEREAS, by resolution dated August 5, 2024, the Town of Onondaga Town Board passed a resolution which approved and endorsed the application of the Jon Diaz Community Center for grant monies available under Title 9 of the Environmental Protection Act of 1993 for a park project to be known as “The Jon Diaz Community Center,” to be located at 6320 South Salina Street, a site located within the territorial jurisdiction of the Town of Onondaga Town; and

WHEREAS, the resolution passed by the Town of Onondaga Town Board erroneously indicated that the Town of Onondaga, and not the Jon Diaz Community Center, Inc., was the applicant to the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP) for such grant monies available under the aforementioned Title 9 of the Environmental Protection Act of 1993; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Onondaga does hereby desire to correct the August 5, 2024, resolution so as to properly indicate that the Jon Diaz Community Center, Inc. is the applicant for such grant monies.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Onondaga hereby does approve and endorse the application submitted by The Jon Diaz Community Center, Inc., to the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, for a grant monies available under Title 9 of the Environmental Protection Act of 1993 for a park project to be known as “The Jon Diaz Community Center,” located at 6320 South Salina Street, in the Town of Onondaga.

6b) Storke Renewables Agreement - EV Charging Stations

Town Attorney Bell reported that the Storke LLC agreement for the EV charging stations was acknowledged at the last Town Board meeting, but there were a couple of things she wanted to review pertaining to the insurance indemnification, which has since been revised. The following resolution resulted:

WHEREAS, the Town of Onondaga Town Board has secured government and utility-provided incentives to subsidize the installation of Elective Vehicle Charging Equipment (“EVCE”) on Town-owned property; and

WHEREAS, to facilitate the installation of the EVCE, the Town Board has received a Statement of Work from Storke, LLC, wherein Storke, LLC will supply and install new, LiteOn Model #KIT-IC48-P8-D Electric Vehicle Level 2 charging stations, at locations identified by the Town of Onondaga at a total project cost, after applying the federal tax credit, of \$126,865.00; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Onondaga Town Board does hereby desire to enter into the proposed Statement of Work presented by Storke, LLC.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Onondaga Town Board does hereby approve the Statement of Work, as presented by Storke, LLC, for the supply and installation of new, LiteOn Model #KIT-IC48-P8-D Electric Vehicle Level 2 charging stations, at locations identified and agreed to by the Town of Onondaga at a total project cost, after applying the federal tax credit, of \$126,865.00, and does further authorize the Town of Onondaga Supervisor to execute same.

Supervisor Mahar stated that this will provide 2 stations with 4 ports at the Town Hall, 2 stations with 4 ports at the Parks and Recreation building, and one station with 2 ports at the Highway Garage.

6c) Bussey/Norton Water District - Lateral Restrictions Resolution

Town Attorney Bell reported that at the 6/2/25 Town Board meeting, it was acknowledged that there were concerns about the NYS Ag & Markets Lateral Restrictions Resolution for the Bussey/Norton Water District and its impact on future development for this district. Attorney Bell stated that there was some ambiguity with the language, and her partner reached out to the Department of Ag and Markets and suggested different language. The Department of Ag & Markets agreed that the new language eliminated any confusion, resulting in the following resolution:

**TOWN OF ONONDAGA
BUSSEY & NORTON ROADS WATER DISTRICT
LATERAL RESTRICTIONS RESOLUTION**

The following resolution was offered by Supervisor Mahar, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilor Fedrizzi, to wit:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Onondaga has proposed improvements for the Bussey & Norton Roads Water District pursuant to Town Law for the express purpose of providing public water supply to residents along portions of Bussey and Norton Roads in the Town of Onondaga, and

WHEREAS, a substantial portion of the land area within the Water District is also within Onondaga County Agricultural District No. 1; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has filed a Notice of Intent to Undertake an Action Within an Agricultural District to evaluate the impact of providing a source of public water supply within this area on lands within Agricultural District No. 1; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets (“Department”) has expressed concern about the potential adverse impact that said public water supply is likely to have on agriculture within the Agricultural District,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board, in recognition of the concerns that have been raised, hereby resolves to adopt the “Lateral Restriction - Conditions on Future Service” specified by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets as follows:

Lateral Restriction - Conditions on Future Service

The Town of Onondaga imposes the following conditions, on the management of water lines located within the Bussey and Norton Roads Water District within an agricultural district, a map of which is attached to this resolution showing the boundaries of the agricultural district in relation to the parcels indicated:

- (1) The only land and/or structures which will be allowed to connect to the proposed waterline within an agricultural district will be existing structures at the time of construction, future agricultural structures, and land and structures that have already been approved for development by the local governing body prior to the date of filing of the Notice of Intent by the municipality.

Land and structures that have been approved for development refer to those properties/structures that have been brought before a local governing body where approval (e.g., subdivision, site plan, special permit) is needed to move forward with project plans and the governing body has approved the action. If no local approval is required for the subdivision of land and/or the construction of structures, the municipality accepts the limitation under Public Health Law §1115 that defines a “subdivision,” in part, as “any tract of land which is divided into five or more parcels.” Water service will not be provided to more than a total of four (4) residences, buildings and/or structures on any tract of land which has been divided into parcels after the date of filing of the NOI by the municipality, and the land is located within a county adopted, State certified agricultural district. All future subdivisions are subject to Town of Onondaga Subdivision Approval per the applicable zoning jurisdiction.
- (2) If a significant hardship can be shown by an existing resident, the lateral restriction to the resident’s property may be removed by the municipality upon approval by the Department. It is the responsibility of the resident landowner to demonstrate that a hardship exists relative to his or her existing water supply and clearly demonstrates the need for public water service. The municipality shall develop a hardship application to be filed with the municipality, approved by the County Department of Health, and agreed to by the Department of Agriculture and Markets.
- (3) If it can be demonstrated to the Department’s satisfaction that the landowner requested the county to remove his or her land from an agricultural district at the time of district review and the county legislative body refused to do so, lateral restrictions may be removed by the municipality if the Department determines that the removal of the restriction for the subject parcel(s) would not have an unreasonably adverse effect on the agricultural district.
- (4) If land is removed from a county adopted, State certified agricultural district and the district has been reviewed by the county legislative body and certified by the Commissioner for modification, lateral restrictions imposed by the municipality are no longer in effect for the parcels of land that have been removed from the agricultural district.
